What is CanSkate?

CanSkate is a "learn to skate" program. The fundamentals of skating are taught to prepare skaters for various sports including, STARSkate program, CanPowerSkate, Hockey, Ringette or for a lifetime of recreational skating.

CanSkate Objectives

- To provide basic skating instruction in a group situation.
- To introduce skaters to the fundamentals of movements of skating in a safe, fun environment.
- To develop balance, coordination and rhythm through music.
- To enable skaters to move through the Skate Canada system smoothly.
- To encourage lifelong participation in skating.
- To promote physical fitness.

Additional CanSkate information

Is your child ready for CanSkate?

There is no minimum age requirement and each child is different however, the Beausejour Skate Club has the criteria to help you decide if your child is ready:

- The ability to understand simple instructions and follow directions from a person other than a parent.
- Able to "separate" from a parent and remain on the ice for the 45 mins session.
- Skates that fit properly and support ankles. Hockey skates or figure skates are the best options. Adjustable skates do not provide the needed support.
- The ability to walk on the floor with reasonable straight ankles while wearing skates.

What is happening on the Ice?

Our Head Coach will provide instruction with support of our trained program assistants who will reinforce instruction, lead activities and perform various tasks as needed by the coach. Each session consist of the following portions:

- ✓ Warm up
- ✓ Lesson time (skill review, new skills, practice time)
- ✓ Group activities (creative expression/skill development, games/action songs)
- ✓ Cool down

Skaters are grouped according to previous badges earned, general skating ability or their age as appropriate. Evaluations will be the responsibility of the Head Coach and will be ongoing. Skaters will receive a report card and badges at the end for their accomplishments.

If you have any questions regarding a skater or the program, please contact the Head Coach or any Executive Member. They will gladly discuss your concerns.

Please contact our club if you have a child interested in figure skating as there are many options available!

Skills, Tests, Achievement, Recognition – this is what STAR is all about!

STAR offers opportunities for skaters of ALL ages to develop fundamental figure skating skills in the areas of ice dance, skating skills, free skate and artistic skating. Skaters have the opportunity to take Skate Canada tests through a nationally standardized testing system.

Star Group - This program is for skaters who have advanced from the CanSkate program and who are continuing their skating journey in the Skate Canada STAR program. * Group STARSkate is training with two coaches as a group for the entire session, and coaching fees are included in the price.

Should skaters choose to enter competitions, the coach will bill each skater individually for any coaching/mileage incurred at such events (coaching is over and above the regular class coaching). Fees would be payable directly to the coach.

**Private STARskate fees are ICE ONLY and coaching fees are billed by and paid directly to the coach. Any coaching for private ice time must be arranged directly with the coach and is dependent on their availability. **

STAR 1 – 5

It takes time for skaters to develop the skills necessary at each level. The STAR 1 - 5 program is designed to allow skaters to be recognized for achievements at various stages.

Skaters will train in skills, dance, freeskate and artistic disciplines. Skaters will have the opportunity to take tests and attend competitions. The skater's coach will advise on the readiness of a skater for tests and the tests are assessed by the skater's coach.

Skate Canada test fees are \$12 per test.

Refunds: <u>For CanSkate and Pre-CanSkate Parent & Tot</u> – The Beausejour Skating Club offers a two-week trial period to decide if your child is ready for either program. If participants are withdrawn from either program within two weeks of starting, a full refund, minus the non-refundable Skate Canada membership fee, will be issued. **For all other Skating Programs** – Prorated refunds for medical reasons will be issued (minus the non-refundable Skate Canada membership fee) and will require a medical note.

Coaching

All of our Skate Canada Programs are coached by NCCP Certified Coaches. The Canskate Program is greatly facilitated with the help of trained, volunteer Program Assistants. Our Club coaches this year will Sarah and Sybil who coach CanSkate and group STARSkate. There could also be other Professional Coaches on the ice who give private lessons.

Coaching Privileges

The BSC Executive authorizes the coach's ice privileges and no coach can offer services at the club without approval. Such approval may be refused or revoked if the coaches violate Skate Canada rules and/or their conduct is contrary to club policies or brings into disrepute the image of the club.

Fundraising

Each skater is required to summit a \$100 fundraising bond upon registration (to a max of 2 bonds per family). If the fundraising requirement is met, you will be reimbursed for this bond. The club provides numerous fundraisers throughout the season to assist members in achieving this amount.

If you wish to stay up-to-date with fundraising programs and deadlines, please ensure we have your email address as all information will be sent via email on a regular basis. If you do not have email, please ensure you check the BSC Bulletin Board as well as our website as all club and fundraising information will be posted there regularly.

Volunteering

We ask that all parents volunteer a small amount of time throughout the season to help support some of the events and programs offered through our club. Some of the events you may be asked to assist with are the ice show (March) and the AGM/Windup.

Inclement Weather

*** As of September 26, 2022 the Executive changed our previous BSC weather policy and we no longer follow the Sunrise School Division closure due to inclement weather. *** If the Sungro Center In Beausejour chooses to close due to weather or other unforeseen events, notification will be posted on the BSC website (<u>www.beausejouskatingclub.com</u>) and the BSC facebook page (<u>https://www.facebook.com/Beausejour-Skating-Club-2206731549604948/</u>), and an email will be sent out to all emails on file. If in doubt please feel free to contact our head coach, club president or any other Executive Member.

Rules and Regulations

- Skaters and parents/guardians agree to maintain a cooperative relationship with skaters, parents/guardians and coaches to ensure a positive skating environment. Bullying, harassment, intimidation, etc. will not be tolerated and inappropriate behavior will result in disciplinary action.
- 2. Helmets are compulsory for all skaters CanSkate Level 5 and under.
- 3. Only registered skaters and Coaches/Program Assistants are allowed on the ice during lessons and practice time.
- 4. No blue jeans are to be worn. We also discourage wearing snow pants as they impair movement. Instead, please dress you skater in layers with nylon splash pants which will allow them the freedom to move.

- 5. Do not wear long scarves or items that impair the skater's vision. No chunky jewelry is to be worn and no sharp objects in pockets.
- 6. Get up quickly after falling.
- 7. Look in the direction you are travelling when skating backwards.
- 8. Make sure starts and stops are completed a safe distance from the boards. No board crashing.
- 9. Long hair must be tied back with a soft accessory (to avoid head injuries in case of a fall).
- 10. No gum or candy on the ice.
- 11. Dressing rooms must be used for changing and putting on/taking off skates.
- 12. No TAG, PUSHING, FIGHTING or CURSING on or off the ice.
- 13. Your child will be told to leave the ice if they choose to disregard the rules during a skating session. It is not the responsibility of the Coach/Program Assistants to discipline the skaters.

Parent Responsibilities and Expectations:

- Learn about your skaters' program and how it operates.
- Join our Facebook page and stay current with club updates and information.
- Check out our bulletin board in the Sungro Lobby for information also.
- Arrive 15 minutes prior to the start of your ice session and ensure younger children use restrooms prior to entering the ice. This will help to avoid lesson disruption.
- Ensure skaters are wearing proper clothing and skates/equipment.
- Have a parent or designated guardian at the arena during sessions.
- Do not "drop and go"; a responsible adult must be present in the arena.
- Parents are not allowed on the ice-surface or in the players box during lesson times unless they are acting in an official club capacity. Parents are not insured by Skate Canada. Parents must move to either the lobby, stands, or around the walking trail after their child is safely in the box or on the ice surface for their lesson.
